



A commerce fest organised by Lilavatibai Podar High School, Mumbai.

Venue: Multipurpose Hall, Aaykar Bhawan





SDG Goals: This event primarily focussed on SDG 4 i.e. 'Quality of Education' due to the simple fact that it was an event designed for them to gain knowledge.







April is celebrated as National Poetry Month in the United States of America. To observe this special month, the American Centre in Kolkata hosted an event in collaboration with the Oxford Book Store on Wednesday, April 27, 2022. Five students from Classes IX and XII- Ishika Srivastava (IX A), Nayonika Bhattacharjee (IX B), Arushi Dubey (XII B), Aindrila Ghoshal (XII A) and Pratyancha Sinha (XII C), accompanied by me, attended the event titled 'There's a Poem in this Place'.

The event was attended by students from five prestigious schools in the city including Modern High School for Girls, Birla High School, Army Public School and Sushila Birla Girls' School. The students were split into groups of five each and given the task of writing a six-line free verse based on the theme of 'Peace', to be completed in a stipulated time of 10 minutes. This was an interesting exercise, bringing out the collaborative and innovative side of the students. It was fascinating to see everyone's writing styles and what that said about them as individuals and eventually amalgamating those into one final product. The students were then asked to prepare a short presentation on the same.

This was followed by the welcome of the US Consul General Melinda Pavek, who gave an inspiring speech about the power of poetry and its impact on the world around us. She also elaborated on the history and significance of US and India ties, especially in the City of Joy.



After this, the teams presented their poems as per their interpretation. From visual imagery and sounds to making posters and props, the students implemented the various elements of their poem in creative ways, delivering strong performances. Themes such as, "The Peace Within", "Peace in Times of War", "Standing Up Against Domestic Violence" etc were highlighted. The judges provided great feedback and declared prizes as well.

Aindrila Ghoshal of Team 3 won the first position, Pratyancha Sinha of Team 1 secured the First Runners Up position and Arushi Dubey of Team 2 secured the Second Runners Up position.


