STORY OF HOW PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA BECAME THE ONLY PLACE IN THE UNITED STATES TO ELIMINATE ALL PUBLIC EDUCATION AFTER THE PASSING OF BROWN V. THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN 1954. 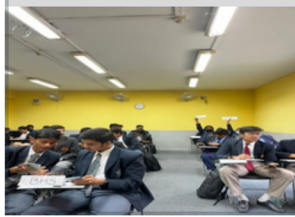

OUR STUDENT RISHAV
MITRA INTERVIEWED
MRS. KUMKUM SOMANI

To get to interview Mrs. Kumkum Somani was a privilege and an honour.

Her new book “SHAAN'S MAGICAL WORLD” strives to create awareness of the world of the visually impaired--- in this case, through the “colourful” adventures of a child with a vivid imagination... a child who is blind.

Besides being a published author, Mrs. Somani has also been a Trustee and Teacher at the G.D. Memorial School which was named after her father- in- law.

Ma'am also has great concern for environment.

Her second book “MOHRA”, again a colouring and doodling book seeks to introduce all to Nature's amazing diversity and beauty.

To interview Ma'am was a great experience for me!

Rishav: Ma'am, what inspired you to write such a book?

Ms. Somani: Well, I drew inspiration from my first Music Teacher who was blind. Despite his handicap, he still taught me singing with passion. Because of him I love Indian classical music is important to be sympathetic or should I say have empathy for those who are suffering or have less.

A student in my School was an advanced Cancer patient who had barely a month to live. I asked her parents why they had sent their child to school instead of letting her rest at home.

I got my answer when the school gong sounded to announce the school break. I saw every child fighting to help the frail little cancer patient! Her fragile state had awakened the empathy within them!

These experiences played a big role in motivating me to write SHAAN'S MAGICAL WALK.

Rishav: Ma'am, what is the difference between sympathy and empathy in terms of how we treat the visually impaired?

Ms. Somani: A good question! It is important to have EMPATHY for the visually impaired, NOT PITY! For instance, we often have a tendency to do work for them thinking they are incapable of doing anything on their own. Would you agree with this?

Rishav: Ma'am, from your book, I was inspired by the character of Shaan who I felt is a symbol of purity and innocence. So what inspired you to invent such a Character?

Ms. Somani: As a Teacher, I got to interact with wonderful and loveable students! I was a Class teacher of Senior KG for three year and each child was more adorable than the other! Infact my own 2 boys would complain that I seemed to love them more than I loved them!!

I also taught journalism to students of Std 9 and 10.

Shaan is a representation of one of those Characters. Every story needs a character people can relate to.

Rishav: It came as a shock for me to discover at the end of the book that Shaan was blind!

Ms. Somani: Good! A climax has to be impactful when writing a story. Every Story needs a climax. Without a climax, the story could just fall flat.

Q5) I'm sure Ma'am after writing your book, there must have been a sense of pride and fulfilment!

Ans) Pride and fulfilment? No! I just felt humbled and grateful because I was given the opportunity of being able to help the cause of the visually impaired.

I also felt grateful that I could see. It made me value the "gifts" in in my life all the more

Q6) Ma'am I also found it interesting that you made it a colouring book... encouraging people to colour with their imagination! What inspired that?

Ans) One was the economic factor. The cost is a lot less when the book is black and white.. Also while colouring, the "artist" spends MORE time on each page! By dwelling longer on each illustration, he subconsciously gets to think about the story's message.

Also, I did this because this way every book will be different. Every book will have a different burst of colour!

Rishav: Ma'am, Leisha Watsa writes that "Encouragement - a moment of your time and appreciation can change a visually impaired child's life."

Ms. Somani: Leisha Watsa is a young girl, a dentist who has done wonderful voluntary work with the inmates of Happy Home for the Blind in Mumbai. She says it's all about believing in them so they can believe themselves. To give them positive reinforcement to enable them to live Life the way they choose to.

'The attitude for gratitude' is resplendent in "Shaan's Colorful World".

As we colour the story with zest and passion, we feel grateful that we can see all those colours.

The World is our Stage to colour with our creativity and imagination.

They took part in races and sang Chai De India, touching the audience's hearts. The visually-impaired children of shelter home Premasree were the guests of a sports meet organised by South City International School, organised on the school grounds on January 13 and 14. They were the special participants on Day 1 while students of Future Hope on January 14, in hosting with South City International School's ethos of inclusion and integration. On Day 1, children from Premasree participated in a Martin Race and a 10m sprint. It was a rare sight, seeing the visually-impaired kids help each other. Children from Future Hope played a game of touch rugby with the students of South City International School on Day 2. Rishav Mitra caught up Premasree resident Shahar Khan and project coordinator Sachina Gupta on the sidelines.

What do you do in Premasree?

Rishav: I am an assistant supervisor at Premasree. I enjoy making agarbattis and playing Cricket.

Are you happy with your life at

Premasree?

Sure! We have visitors there. It makes us all of us very happy.

What inspired the birth of such a powerful organization?

Sachina: All credit goes to our founder Hope Nair. He was the heart behind the project, the man with a vision. He wanted to create a safe and powerful environment for the visually-impaired.

What do the children learn there?

Sachina: The Children have learnt so many things. They have learnt how to make agarbattis, they have learnt music and computers. They have also learnt agriculture and mushroom cultivation.

What do you hope for Premasree in the future?
